

Minutes of South Beaver Township Regular Meeting

November 12, 2018

The regular November meeting of the South Beaver Township Board of Supervisors held in the South Beaver Municipal Building located at 805 Blackhawk Road was called to order at 7:00 P.M. by Chairman Robert Wood. The Pledge of Allegiance followed.

Officials present: Robert Wood, Jack Mintier, Thomas Miller, George Patterson, Kevin Brett, Dan McLean, Ashley Carr

Others present: Mary Jo Paswell, Christina Corbin, Martha Golnick, Larry McCandless, Andy Leech

Robert Wood made a motion to approve the minutes of the regular October meeting. Jack Mintier seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Robert Wood made a motion to approve the Treasurer's Report and pay the following bills: General Fund, Check No. #13478-#13528, Total \$78,287.96; Payroll Fund, Check #9898-#9945, Total \$38,504.77; State Fund, Check #2055-#2059, Total \$84,671.65; PLGIT Bond, Check #177-#180, Total \$16,091.11. Jack Mintier seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Kevin Brett gave the Engineers report. It will be filed. Kevin reported he is waiting to hear back from PennDot on the Watts Mill Turnback project but if the board wanted they could approve the resolution contingent upon receiving the check from Penn Dot. The Supervisors tabled the discussion until they get a response from PennDot.

Dan McLean read the police report. It will be filed. Dan reported that the 2013 impala hit a deer over the weekend, it has been turned into the insurance and Auto Body Works feels as if the vehicle can be fixed. The police department received a grant from Walmart for \$1,500 and will be receiving it in 4-6 weeks. Dan asked the Supervisors if it would be ok to spend \$2,500-\$2,700 to finish off items needed at the police department. This would include lockers, a cabinet and an evidence bin. Jack Mintier made a motion to approve the purchase of the requested items from Chief McLean. Robert Wood seconded the motion. Motion carried.

A copy of the road report was distributed.

Ashley Carr read the fire report. It will be filed.

Christina Corbin was present to report that Russell Reed is dumping road material on his property and has dump trucks running all hours of the night and the tailgates banging are keeping several of the neighbors up at night for the last couple months. Dan McLean had taken a look at the property and reported that the material is blacktop and clean fill. Christina is also concerned because she believes the material is rolling down onto her property. Robert Wood will go talk to Russell in the morning and take a look at the site.

Larry McCandless was present and reported that the fire department got quotes on several trucks ranging from \$246,000-\$608,000 and provided the Supervisors with information on each truck. Larry also received a call from 1st Out informing him that the price on the truck the Township had been interested has been reduced to \$355,000. Ashley Carr will get financing information from Community Leasing, WesBanco and First National and report back at the second meeting this month.

Robert Wood made a motion to accept the bid for 500 Tons of Anti-Skid Type 3A @\$14.71 per ton delivered from McClymonds Supply & Transit Co., Inc. Thomas Miller seconded the motion. Motion carried. BCRCOG had to rebid the salt contract. The Supervisors will hold a meeting on November 26th at 7:00pm to award the contract if any are received.

Jack Mintier made a motion to approve the payment of \$10,790 for a sign at the fire hall to Precision Sign and Awning as an expense from the 2017 Capital Projects Fund. Robert Wood seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Robert Wood made a motion to approve a donation of \$1,500 to the Recreation Board. Thomas Miller seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Robert Wood made a motion to approve the preliminary budget for 2019. The real estate mileage will remain at 12.5 mills, \$5.00 Per Capita Tax, 5% Wage Taxes, 5% Real Estate Transfer Taxes, 3 mill Fire Tax, Street Lighting .40 per frontage foot, and Water District 0.02% of Assessed Value. A notice will be advertised in the paper and the final budget will be adopted at the regular supervisors meeting on December 10, 2018. Thomas Miller seconded the motion. Motion carried.

An anonymous letter was received from a resident stating that vehicles at 333 State Route 168 are not inspected or up to date on plate. The Supervisors agreed to send a letter to the property owner.

A thank you letter was received for the use of the park for a memorial service.

The Supervisors received invitations to the LSSE Holiday Party.

The LSSE Fall 2018 Newsletter was distributed.

The PSATS News Bulletin for September and October was distributed.

Robert Wood adjourned the meeting at 8:00 P.M.
