

Minutes of South Beaver Township Regular Meeting

September 14, 2020

The regular September meeting of the South Beaver Township Board of Supervisors held in the South Beaver Municipal Building located at 805 Blackhawk Road was called to order at 7:01 P.M. by Chairman Jack Mintier. The Pledge of Allegiance followed.

Officials present: Jack Mintier, Thomas Miller, John Onuska, Josh Callendar and George Patterson

Others present: Kevin Henderson, Keith Girting, Jr., Irene Ridenour

Thomas Miller made a motion to approve the minutes of the August meeting. John Onuska seconded the motion. Motion carried.

John Onuska made a motion to approve the Treasurer's Report and pay the following bills: General Fund, Check No. #14493-#14534, Total \$26,836.34; Payroll Fund, Check #10614-#10661, Total \$40,037.92; State Fund, Check No. #2087-#2092, Total \$89,815.52. Thomas Miller seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Josh Callendar gave the engineers report and informed that board that we are still waiting on Youngblood to give a date to finish up Swamp Poodle with paving.

Dan Petrich gave the police report. It will be filed. Dan reported that 246 needed to have some final repairs after the deer accident and is currently at IBISTech. The shotguns that were previously approved has still not be purchased and it is hard to find them within the approved price range. John Onuska made a motion to increase the shotgun budget by \$400. Thomas Miller seconded the motion. Motion carried. Dan asked for approval to update the CSI kit. John made a motion to approve his request, Thomas Miller seconded the motion. Motion carried. A discussion was held on trick or treat and it was decided that no matter what the rest of the county does South Beaver will hold a trick or treat on the 29th.

Kevin Henderson gave the road report. Kevin reported that if the department has the time and there is money left over in the budget that he would like to get Gailey and Darlington Roads done. Kevin asked to scrap the old snoplows and roller. John Onuska made the motion to scrap the snowplows and roller. Thomas Miller seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Keith Girting, Jr. gave the fire report. He reported that the firemen's breakfasts are on hold at the moment until we see what is going on with COVID. Both engines will be going up to first out for pump tests. Keith is going to become a VFIS EVOC instructor to help save the township money.

Irene Ridenour was present looking for an update on Blackhawk Hills. She said a new email had been sent at the end of August with a new punch list. Due to John Heyl not being present at the meeting there was no update. When she asked George about the email, he stated that he had not had a chance yet to review the email but questioned if the developer had been doing work. He pointed out we don't want to push them too hard if they are making improvements. Irene stated they have not been there doing work since the last meeting. George said he will talk with John Heyl and see what still needs to be done.

Thomas Miller made a motion to approve the authorization of eminent domain for the Watts Mill Slide Repair. John Onuska seconded the motion. Motion carried.

John Onuska made a motion to approve the MMO worksheets for the Police and Non Uniform pension plans. Thomas Miller seconded the motion. Motion carried.

A request was made by Ronald Pullman to name three of his driveways. No action was taken.

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Darlington Borough asked South Beaver Township if they would be interested in having the police contract for the Borough, after a discussion with Chief Petrich the board declined to make an offer.

John Onuska made a motion to approve the Non-Community Water System Application for the fire hall. Thomas Miller seconded the motion. Motion carried.

PSATS News Bulletin for August was distributed to the board.

Jack Mintier adjourned the meeting at 7:52 P.M.
