

**Minutes of South Beaver Township Regular Meeting**

**April 8, 2026**

The regular April meeting of the South Beaver Township Board of Supervisors held in the South Beaver Municipal Building located at 805 Blackhawk Road was called to order at 7:00 P.M. by Chairman Jack Mintier. The Pledge of Allegiance followed.

Officials present: Jack Mintier, Tom Miller, Jake Rosenberger, John Heyl, Nathan Morgan

Others present: Josh Krut

Thomas Miller made a motion to approve the March meeting minutes. Jake Rosenberger seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Thomas Miller made a motion to approve the Treasurer's Report and pay the following bills: General Fund, Check No. #17141-#17159, Total \$31,279.92, Payroll Fund, Check No. #12838-#12857, Total \$25,707.53, State Fund, Check No. #2218-2222, Total \$33,969.11. Jake Rosenberger seconded the motion. Motion carried.

There were no announcements.

John Heyl gave the Engineer's report. It will be filed. John said there was no update on the AT&T application that was submitted for conditional use as no new information was received. The contractor for the park project will begin working on the trail project soon. Based on last month's meeting John started a word file for the 2026 ordinance amendments with the change to remove cell towers from the agricultural district and he will get the board a draft ordinance next week to change data centers to a conditional use in the industrial district. With being a conditional use, the Township can choose setbacks, buffers and sound mitigation among other items to be discussed. John offered his help in filling out the necessary paperwork for the flashing stop sign beacons, Josh is still working through discussions with Penn Dot on this. Josh requested a standard detail for utilities cross ditching and backfill, which John will provide. John brought up for the Township to consider to adopt a road opening ordinance that if an applicant cuts the road, it isn't just patch to avoid spot repairs that don't last.

Dan Petrich gave the Police report. It will be filed.

Josh Krut gave the Road report. The Road Department started doing road repairs on McBride and patch work on Moore. Josh would like to purchase 3,000 tons of millings through PennDot with machine rental at \$1,700 a week and trucking estimated between \$19,100-\$27,000 which would be a significant savings to the Township versus purchasing 2A and can be purchased with liquid fuels funds.

There was no Fire Report.

Levi Stahl was not present to report on the intersection of 168 & 51.

Nathan Morgan reported that last month the board approved the Winter Maintenance and Mowing Agreements with PennDot contingent upon his review of the definition of a severe winter adjustment which is not defined in the agreement nor does he think PennDot would be willing to define it, the authority to audit books which didn't concern Nate and the need to be aware of the state SEMP program, which Nate provided Josh documentation so he can familiarize himself with the program. There were no other concerns and no action necessary as the agreements were approved at last month's meeting.

Tom Miller made a motion to approve the purchase of 3,000 tons of millings from Penn Dot for Swamp Poodle, Lihi and Sportsman. Jake Rosenberger seconded the motion. Motion carried.

**April 8, 2026**

Jake Rosenberger made a motion to authorize Josh to line up a delivery company to haul the millings contingent upon receiving three telephonic quotes. Tom Miller seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Jack Mintier adjourned the meeting at 7:31 P.M.
