

Minutes of South Beaver Township Regular Meeting

August 12, 2026

The regular August meeting of the South Beaver Township Board of Supervisors held in the South Beaver Municipal Building located at 805 Blackhawk Road was called to order at 7:00 P.M. by Chairman Jack Mintier. The Pledge of Allegiance followed.

Tom Miller made a motion to approve the July meeting minutes. Jake Rosenberger seconded the motion. Motion carried.

There was no Treasurer's Report.

John Heyl gave the Engineer's report. It will be filed.

A copy of Police Report was given. Tom Miller made a motion to accept Officer Barrs status change from full time to part time. Jake Mintier seconded the motion. Motion carried. The Supervisors were in favor of receiving quotes for a new Tahoe to replace the explorer and holding a further discussion once received.

Josh Krut gave the Road report. Josh said the radios need updated in the trucks. The fire department and police have radios they are getting rid of and will see if they will work for the road department. The road department is interested in purchasing a box truck from Tom Miller, Nathan Morgan will do research on this and to make sure this would it's an allowable purchase that it meets the thresholds for how much money a supervisor can receive from the Township.

Keith Girting gave the fire report. Keith reported that when Old Blackhawk Road was shut down for three days last month that there was no help from the utility companies or PennDot and suggested there has to be a better way and that the fire or police cannot stay at a downed tree for a shift especially during an active storm. Nate Morgan said the Township needs to make it as safe as they can once they become aware it, work diligently to attempt to notify the proper utilities and make sure that contact with them is documented.

Josh informed the board that the Sportsmen's Club is holding a kid invitational this weekend and Sportsman Road will be shut down during the event to keep everyone safe.

There were no updates on the intersection of 168 & 51.

Tom Miller made a motion to approve paying WestComm Wireless \$3,525.00 for radio programming through the Fire Tax. Jake Rosenberger seconded the motion. Motion carried.

A tentative agreement was discussed for the Police Collective Bargaining Agreement and a resolution will be prepared for next month's meeting.

The supervisors were in favor of creating a formal complaint form.

Jack Mintier adjourned the meeting at 7:59 P.M.
